You have received this newsletter because you have previously supported Shepherd's Crossing or have been identified as someone who might find our cause to be worthwhile. This year, through July, your gifts have enabled us to assist 629 families. We've distributed \$64,200 to pay past due rents, \$68,800 to pay utility bills and \$4,000 to buy medicines. Mark and Nancy recently had their second child. Because of some health issues with the baby, Nancy could not return to work. Their meager savings account lasted just a few weeks while Nancy cared for the new baby. The couple felt guilty asking Shepherd's Crossing for help—they had never before needed such assistance. While an unoccupied volunteer took care of the older child, a caring counselor called the company holding their mortgage and managed to get payments waived for two months. The counselor also arranged to help with one of the couple's utility bills. Later, Nancy sent a note of deep appreciation to the office to say that she returned to work the following month. Her note asked that we thank that nice man who helped us through such a dark time.

also download a sponsorship form from that website. The College of Business Administration and its student ambassadors organize and conduct the run on the K-State campus. It started in 2012 on the 50th Anniversary of the College and was named in honor of its first dean, C. Clyde Jones. In 2014, sixty-four donated \$20,525 plus in-kind contributions of more than \$4,000 from GTM (shirts), Manhattan Broadcasting Company (radio spots) and Pepsi-Cola (soft drinks and water).

This year's run/walk features teams from churches and other organizations with awards for teams and individuals. The church with the most participants will receive a traveling trophy, currently held by First United Methodist. Does your church have a poster and enrollment brochures?
