Meet Luis: Learning How to Help His Family

Maria, a native Kansan, married Luis in Costa Rica, then moved back to Kansas. After four daughters were born in seven years Maria was sentenced to prison. Luis has raised his daughters by himself with some help from friends. Luis struggled to support his family because daycare took much of his income. As the children grew older, child care decreased but a back injury reduced the number of hours Luis could work. Luis could not afford health insurance, therefore he went without needed medical care for his injury while he continued to work part-time. Luis came to Shepherd's Crossing a few times for financial assistance. He was embarrassed to ask for help, but without fulltime wages he could not pay all of his bills. During one of his visits to Shepherd's Crossing some of the counselors realized that Luis needed care for his painful back and arrangements were made for Luis to receive some free medical care. Those services provided much relief. His employer also gave him responsibilities that were less physically demanding. With the personal attention and caring spirit, Shepherd's Crossing counseling
