Ruben lived in big city in middle America with very little care and support. He lost contact with his parents when he was 12 and seldom attended school. His lifestyle was typified by hunger and sleeping on the street, despite his attempts to avoid the streets. Ruben met his future wife, who came from similar circumstances. He found part-time work, but as his six children were born, Ruben and his wife agreed to find a way out of their situation and a safe place to raise their family. They chose Kansas.

The family found a much better environment here, but Ruben struggled to find secure work. Recently, he became employed and reached out to Shepherd's Crossing for assistance with a utility bill that was only being partly paid each month. Shepherd's Crossing was able to provide some assistance and helped set up a plan for Ruben to get caught up with that utility. Ruben left Shepherd's Crossing with a big smile, saying "thank you, thank you," for the generous support of the Manhattan community.
